As the postgraduate and early-career European Studies network, our new name better reflects our reach and members. However, our main principles remain the same.

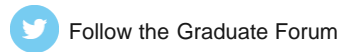
We are a supportive, interdisciplinary network providing training opportunities and connecting scholars in the early stages of their career researching Europe and the EU.

Palgrave's long-established and successful series of high-level texts on the EU – *The European Union Series* – which has published almost 70 books on the EU over its twenty years lifetime, has come under revised editorship. Former UACES chair, William Paterson, who co-edited the series with Neill Nugent, retired from his co-editorship in early 2018 and has been replaced by Simon Bulmer (Professor of European Politics, University of Sheffield).

Simon, who was joint editor of the *Journal of Common Market Studies* from 1991-8, has written extensively on the European Union, focusing particularly on EU governance, the single market, EU-member state relations (especially Germany and the UK) and, most recently, on critical integration theory.

Neill Nugent remains as co-editor of the series with Simon. Both Neill and Simon have been UACES members for nearly 40 years and both are recent recipients of the UACES Lifetime Achievement Award.
